COMMUNITY ENHANCEMENT – Llangattock Litter Pickers have been busy over the past month, with 6 volunteers contributing their time and energy to keeping the local verges tidy and looking their very best. In total, the volunteers put in 33 hours and collected 17 bags of litter – just under 123kg – of which 76% went for recycling. The group cleared an impressive 196 miles of road- and canalside verge and expanded their reach, adding a new area to their monthly schedule.

WOODLANDS – The woodland group's firewood processor has been earning its keep over the past month, as the group makes steady progress splitting and stacking timber felled over the winter for seasoning. The photos below shows the results of last Tuesday's efforts at the Dan-y-Graig woodland – with two tidy stacks of firewood, plus smaller offcuts that will be used for making charcoal. The group is currently taking firewood orders for autumn delivery, at £60 per load. To place your order, email woodlands@llangattockgreenvalleys.org.

In other news, the group is working with the Canal & River Trust and local boat hire operators on the Vista project, which aims to encourage boaters, walkers and locals to take a closer look at the woodland habitats that line the Monmouthshire and Brecon Canal, and, through selective felling, open up views along this wonderful canal. Environment Wales is supporting the project.

The group has also been invited to participate in the Trust's new Community Adoptions Scheme, which aims to get communities along the canal actively involved in environmental projects and other improvements. The woodland group already manages the Canalside wood for the Trust, and has recently taken on a small woodland on the Dardy for the Glanusk Estate, so the Scheme is an excellent fit. As the Canal & River Trust's volunteer coordinator Alan Sumnall says: 'Community Adoptions are essentially when a local group gets together and plays an active role to improve their local area. This is exactly what LCWG already do, and both wildlife and the local community are benefiting from their work along the M&B canal.'

MICRO-ENERGY GENERATION

It's been another busy month with our micro-hydro schemes. In conjunction with our partner company TGV Hydro, we've been assessing the second batch of the phase 2 feasibility study reports and talking to those landowners involved, prior to deciding which schemes to take forward into the design and permissions phase. Some of the phase 1 schemes need to have flow gauge monitoring, to compare the actual stream flow with the forecasted flow, so some of the LGV Ventures team will be undergoing training and starting the flow monitoring later this month. We're also in discussions with TGV Hydro about a possible joint venture, to mature some potential hydro schemes on Forestry Commission lands.
