Your electricity tariff: explained

Your Energy Local electricity tariff consists of two parts designed to support local renewables and save you money. These are:

- The local renewable energy tariff (price)
- The Time of Use Tariff (TOUT)

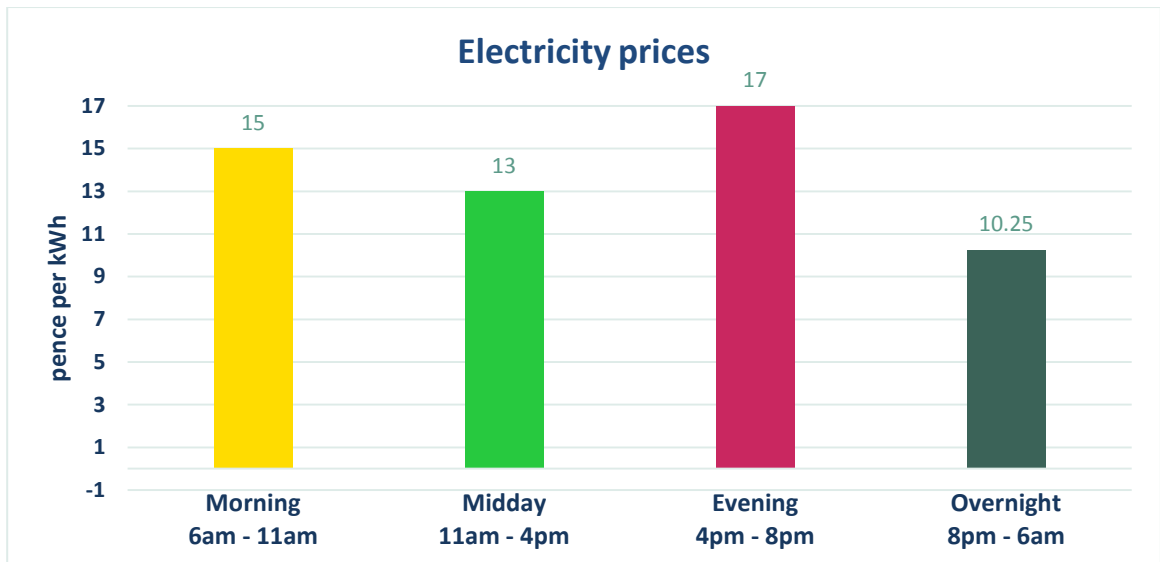
The renewables

Along with local households, a local renewable energy generator is also a member of the club. Club members' work together to agree a price that households will pay for their share of electricity they use when local renewable energy is being generated. This price will be higher than what the local renewable generator would normally receive, but lower than what the households would normally pay. So, everyone wins!

The TOUT

Sometimes it will be possible to match all of the electricity you use to locally-generated electricity. At other times the club will use more than is available. For the extra electricity, you will be charged at different rates for this depending on the time of day. This will be cheaper during the night and at lunchtime, but more expensive at breakfast and tea time. This is called a "Time of Use Tariff".

The graph below shows both parts of the tariff. You can find more details from your Club about the price for local renewables and for extra electricity.
